In2Music Prices

Whole-Class Ensemble Tuition (WCET)

Pupils learn a musical instrument from an instrumental specialist in whole class groups. Instruments available: trumpet, ukulele, djembe, flute, guitar, recorder, samba and bamboo tamboo.

General Musicianship (GM)

Pupils develop the core musical skills, knowledge and understanding using a range of classroom instruments and singing. Perfect for KS1 and lower KS2 pre-WCET.

Parent-Funded Instrumental Lessons

Help your pupils to start their musical journey by offering one-to-one, paired and small group instrumental lessons via MMF. Lessons take place in school, during the school day delivered by specialist tutors.

MMF applies the same rigorous standards as schools in recruiting and vetting its teaching staff and provides quality assurance of teaching and learning through regular lesson observations and staff training.

Lessons are parent/guardian funded (financial assistance available) and administered by MMF; schools simply provide a teaching space.



Nurture Groups

Targeted Intervention

Improving Social Outcomes for Pupils

Small group, 30-minute weekly sessions delivered by a music specialist trained by MMF in partnership with the Changing Tracks National Nurture Group programme. Music making is used as an entry point for developing pupils' emotional resilience. For schoolselected targeted groups of pupils at risk of poor educational outcomes.
